RE: Bid Information for Watershed Dam Mowing, General Maintenance & Contractor Support Contract

Prospective Contractors:

Thank you for your interest in the bid information for the Watershed Dam Mowing, General Maintenance and Contractor Support contract as presented by the Peter Francisco Soil and Water Conservation District (PFSWCD). This letter and attached documents will summarize the project expectations.

Prospective contractors are required to have liability insurance that covers up to \$1,000,000 with proof of workman's compensation in order to be considered.

Proof of insurance coverage and pesticide/herbicide applicator's license MUST be supplied at time of bid submission.

Mowing, General Maintenance & Contractor Support summary:

The mowing, general maintenance and contractor support contract is organized as a maximum of 3 years, on a year-by-year basis, upon satisfactory completion of each year. Each "year" consists of a Fall and a Spring mowing cycle (Fall 2024-Spring 2025, etc.). Bid amount submitted will be used for each year, IF each additional year is granted. Payment will be made after job has been completed and reviewed by District Directors and/or staff and contractor has submitted an invoice. A copy of pesticide applicator's certificate and proof of insurance coverage MUST be included along with bid information. This packet is also available on our website at www.peterfranciscoswcd.org.

Bids are due to the PFSWCD office by Friday, February 16, 2024 4:30 p.m. A locked drop box is available to the left of the USDA Service Center front door for outside business hours deliveries. Contractors awarded the bid will be notified after Wednesday, February 21, 2024. After being contacted by the District, the chosen contractor(s) and District Directors/Staff will review the contract(s). The completion deadline for the Fall round of Year 1 of mowing & general maintenance is October 31, 2024.
